### Goals for you as a Visitor/Volunteer/Intern/Instructor/International Worker (IW):

- 1) Remember Nhu desires you would learn about:
  - a) The Culture
  - b) The Problem: the use of children in the sex trade
  - c) The Reasons behind the existence of the problem: crime, corruption, religious apathy and economics.
- 2) Remember Nhu desires that you would be safe and healthy.
- 3) R-Nhu desires that the above goals be accomplished in the most enjoyable way possible.

### Guidelines for your time as a Visitor/Volunteer/Intern/Instructor/International Worker:

Due to the goals and the complex issues involved, certain guidelines will be agreed upon prior to your travel. Traveling plans are less certain overseas than plans within the U.S. Schedule changes are inevitable and events you may be “looking forward to” most are subject to change or cancellation, while others events may be added. This uncertainty requires you to be flexible and willing to accept changes with a good attitude.

Every country has a different culture and each is different than the culture in America. Therefore, R-Nhu has adopted a motto for Visitor/Volunteers/Interns/Instructors/IWs. The motto is, “It is not better, it is not worse, it is just different.” Many cultures are several hundred years old and some of the things that the local people do may seem senseless to you. The leaders of R-Nhu may do things that seem senseless to you as well. In these cases please withhold from making negative comments, remember our motto, and do your best to understand that this is simply a part of working and living in a different culture.

With the increasing popularity of social networking, blogging and online picture sharing, we would appreciate your cooperation to help us protect the Children of Remember Nhu. For all electronic imaging, communication and electronic transmissions (including Facebook, Twitter, Blogs, etc.) **please reference the location, photos of people, etc...only as “Asia” or the country you are speaking about.** Please do not reference the world “H.E.L.P. Thailand”, “H.E.L.P. Cambodia, etc. in your electronic imaging, electronic communications and/or electronic transmissions. Referencing “Remember Nhu” is fine except as it pertains to certain unnamed countries. **Please NEVER mention the names of specific children in our homes. If you tell any of the children’s stories, please change some aspects of their story.** All of this is for the protection of our Children and R-Nhu. If you are uncertain on any of the issues, please ask a Remember Nhu staff member.

When being a Visitor/Volunteer/Intern/Instructor/IW in a non-U.S. country, you may be asked to refrain from doing certain things, and asked to do certain other things. Please keep in mind all three of R-Nhu’s goals for your trip. These goals are for your individual and group benefit. We want your time to be as beneficial, safe and fun as possible. Therefore, please trust the judgment of your group leaders. If you behave in a way that is contrary to what you are told by R-Nhu leaders, you will be responsible for any consequences that may arise from those actions.

If during your trip you have any concerns about R-Nhu's staff, policies or organization; we ask that you communicate those openly to the appropriate R-Nhu staff. Our staff members and leaders hold an open door policy, particularly about anything that would affect our Children's best interests.

If you have any concerns we ask that you deal with them directly, avoiding gossip. Making damaging negative remarks or inappropriately conversing with someone regarding R-Nhu and its members can result in adverse effects on the Children. If you are involved in this, you may be asked to leave at your expense. "Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen." Ephesians 4:29

Please remember that during your trip you will have a limited view of the overall organization, and culturally you may not understand everything that happens. We ask you to recognize that your words could have lasting consequences for R-Nhu or the Children we care for, even to the point of preventing us from carrying out our mission of "Preventing the use of children in the sex trade around the world". By signing this release you agree to handle any concerns you have about R-Nhu with prayerful consideration, personal reflection, discernment and discretion. ### **REMEMBER NHU ~ BEHAVIOR GUIDELINES AT A R-NHU HOME**

Remember Nhu (R-Nhu) welcomes the opportunity to host national and international visitors. As you may understand, we require a very high standard of conduct from all visitors in order to protect the children and maintain a nurturing, safe, and happy family environment for the children and staff.

All R-Nhu staff members are trained regarding our Child Protection Policies and understand the issues pertaining to the children in their country. R-Nhu staff educate the children on the importance of personal safety and space. In particular, we work hard to educate children about the dangers of locals and foreigners looking to exploit children. You, as a visitor, have a role to play in the protection and well-being of the children and staff. Please read carefully the behavioral guidelines you are expected to follow while visiting our Children's Homes. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

**You may NEVER be alone with a child. If you get caught being alone with a child you will be immediately sent home at your own expense and you may be taken to local authorities as well.**

Remember to act in a way that respects the local culture. Advice can be found in the "Remember Nhu ~ (Country) Cultural Info" Handout. However, please review the following reminders:

- ○ CLOTHING: Female attire needs to cover shoulders, chest, stomach, and to the knees. Skimpy shorts and tank tops are inappropriate clothing. Male attire should likewise be modest. Tank tops, while appropriate for a work site, are not appropriate around the children. Our intention is to model Christ-like modesty for our children.
- ○ AFFECTION: Be particularly aware of physical contact between men & women. Displays of affection between genders are not acceptable. Please be very aware of hugs, hand-holding, and physical touch with the children in our homes (redirect them to an appropriate activity i.e. volleyball, chase, soccer etc.). We want them to know they are loved, but we do not want to push our Western culture onto them when it comes to physical contact. Please be extremely respectful particularly between men/girl interactions.
- ○ FAVORS: Most R-Nhu indigenous staff will do anything for you, to their own or R-Nhu's detriment. They are very unlikely to say no to a favor you ask. Please avoid taking advantage of this. We request that you do not ask the children or R-Nhu staff to wait on you.
- Direct any discipline matters to house parents or help staff. You may never discipline a child. Avoid inappropriate attention seeking behavior, such as tantrums or crushes.

- For all electronic imaging, communication and transmissions (Including Facebook, Twitter, Blogs, Picture Sharing etc...) you must reference the location, photos of people and all other references as "Asia", "Africa", or "Thailand." Do not reference the words "H.E.L.P. Thailand" without approval. NEVER mention the names of specific children in our homes. This is for the protection of our children and R-Nhu.
- Give the children their right to personal privacy; consider how it may be to have people visiting their homes, especially given the nature of why the children are placed in our homes.
- Be extremely sensitive and tactful regarding a child's personal story, background, or reason why they are involved in an R-Nhu home. Please do not ask them directly about their past. Let them bring it up if they wish, when it applies, and in an appropriate setting.
- You must have a staff member approve and be accompanied by a staff member for any visit to the children's rooms. In general these areas of the house should not be visited.
- Visitors are asked to leave the Children's Home promptly at 7:30 PM on school days, even if the children or house parents ask you to stay (even for homework). This will allow our children have appropriate time to complete their homework and keep their established evening routines.
- Do not discuss the Children's Home with the community or church members in the city of the Children's Home.
- If you smoke, please do so off the premises from our Children's Homes. Smoking in some foreign countries has a different connotation than in the U.S. Smoking will negatively affect our children.
- Allow the children to get accustomed to you before taking their picture and/or a video. It is advisable to not let the children use or play with your camera. Entire trip photos have been deleted accidentally because they do not know how to read the English words on your camera.
- If you desire to have contact beyond your visit, you may communicate with the whole home, not an individual child. Please discuss this with R-Nhu staff before sending anything.
- If you would like to pass a gift on to a child or staff member, please give it to the House Parents or staff for them to distribute it appropriately.
- If, during your visit, you have any concerns about Remember Nhu's staff, policies, or organization, we ask that you communicate those openly to the appropriate parties. Our staff members and leaders hold an open door policy; particularly about anything that would affect our children's best interests. We ask that if you have any concerns, you will deal with them maturely. Please always avoid spreading gossip, making damaging negative remarks, or inappropriately conversing with someone regarding our organization and its members.
- Thank you for your complying with R-Nhu's Guidelines.
